

# Defend George Galloway

He rightly pointed the finger of blame for the slaughter in Iraq at Bush and Blair and consistently demanded the war be stopped. He told the truth and that's why the Labour Party has suspended him.

In the recent local elections the Socialist Alliance saw its first election victory with the election of Michael Lavalette in Preston. There were many other very good results around the country.

The anti-war protests and the success of the Scottish Socialist Party, with 6 MSPs elected, and the Socialist Alliance in England show that there is an enormous potential to build a principled socialist alternative to Blair and New Labour.

The Socialist Alliance has launched a new initiative to try to bring together all those in the anti-war movement and beyond who want to mount the most effective challenge to Blair in the European and local elections in June 2004.

The Liberal Democrats are no answer—they supported the war after it began and where they control the council they privatise and cut just like New Labour.
